## **Prairie Heights Family Survey**

## Results from August 2012

After a presentation by Jane Groff, Director of Kansas Parent Information Resource Center (KPIEC), during the 2011 – 2012 school year, the District Planning Team determined our district needed to emphasize greater family engagement, since it is linked to increased student achievement. As a Title I district, USD 417 is to have family engagement policies and practices in place, so this too, supported the decision. The District Planning Team selected the PTA - The Power of Partnerships Family Survey to be administered each August during enrollment and then have the Site Council members analyze the results.

The PTA survey was provided for parents to complete at the August 2012 enrollment. In that same month all district employees and Site Council members were invited to hear Jane Groff speak about how family involvement is connected to educational success.

73 (76 families) surveys were completed in August of 2012. The positive points from parents at Prairie Heights Elementary was Welcoming All Families into the School Community. The focus for improvement was sharing power and collaboration between the school and communities. According to the Prairie Heights Middle School parents, strength was shown in the area of Welcoming. The focus for improvement was in sharing power between the school and communities.

Actions taken to improve sharing the power and collaboration between both schools and the communities were as follows: taking part in community celebrations at both Alta Vista and Dwight, providing decorations for the community Christmas trees in both towns, involvement with Project 7, PHMS Family Fun Nights, community clean up, touring local points of interests, informing patrons of all of the opportunities to serve on district committees and encouraging patrons to take an active role in Site Council, PTO, and to attend Board of Education meetings, to mention some of the actions.
