English Language Arts: Big for us this year

Math: Getting ready for a big year. 1<sup>st</sup> SAC in 9yrs

**Social Studies**: Teacher made those changes and the classroom assessments were completed, thank you! **Science**: To clear up some common misconceptions for CGHS.

- We have 3 required science courses (Integrated Physics, Integrated Chemistry, Integrated Biology
- "Integrated" means Earth/Space Science topics are integrated into each required course; all required courses follow the Next Generation Science Standards

We also offer an Advanced Physics (11<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade) that is an elective.

Individual Plans of Study and Social Emotional Learning: New Individual Plan of Study (including Xello) lessons for each grade level.

**Computer Science**: K-2 on their second year; all 7-8 teachers will work to align computer science topics in their courses with Computer Science Standards in Oct. 2023; District must offer at least one science course by 2023-24 in grades 9-11 (can be online)

CTE, Fine Arts, Health-PE and Foreign Language: Deleted Theatre II; added new Forensics
